36. Stresses the importance of the recently concluded modernisation of the EU-Mexico association agreement and the conclusion of the Mercosur association agreement, which both have the potential to deepen our strategic partnership with Latin America, to create additional opportunities in our trade relations with those countries, and to help diversify supply chains for the European economy; considers that the association agreement between the EU and Mercosur represents the largest ‘bloc to bloc’ deal of its kind and has the potential to create a mutually beneficial open market area encompassing approximately 800 million citizens; points out that this agreement, like all EU trade agreements, must ensure fair competition and guarantee that European production standards and methods are upheld; points out that the agreement contains a binding chapter on sustainable development that must be applied, implemented and fully assessed, as well as specific commitments on labour rights and environmental protection, including the implementation of

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the Paris climate agreement and the relevant implementing rules;

the Paris climate agreement and the relevant implementing rules; ***is extremely concerned about Jair Bolsonaro's environmental policy, which goes against the commitments made in the Paris agreement, in particular as regards combating global warming and protecting biodiversity; emphasises, in these circumstances, that the EU-Mercosur agreement cannot be ratified as it stands;***

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
